Dear Parents and Carers,

Re: Curriculum Information for Half Term 2 (3rd November to 19th December)

The information in this letter outlines Curriculum, Home Learning, and Extracurricular activities for this term.

Through our curriculum, we provide a wide range of learning experiences both inside and outside of the classroom, aimed at fostering a love of learning and providing opportunities to experience success and fulfilment. Leaders and teachers at HEA and United Learning plan the content, and the sequence of learning, very carefully to aid efficiency and create meaningful connections. Arbor: Parents/Carers are able to track both positive and negative points within school on the Arbor app, as well as attendance and the school timetable.


