Dear Parents and Carers,

Re: Curriculum Information for Half Term 2 (3rd November to 19th December)

The information in this letter outlines Curriculum, Home Learning, and Extracurricular activities for this term.

Through our curriculum, we provide a wide range of learning experiences both inside and outside of the classroom, aimed at fostering a love of learning and providing opportunities to experience success and fulfilment. Leaders and teachers at HEA and United Learning plan the content, and the sequence of learning, very carefully to aid efficiency and create meaningful connections. MFL	Festivals and traditions: learning about native-speaking countries and festivals, customs and celebrations. Expressing opinions on typical foods and traditions.				
Art	Colour and landscape, the art of David Hockney and perspective drawing

Drama	Continuation of the topic 'Hillsborough' - exploring conscience through dramatic techniques				
Food Tech	Exploring Diabetes through an investigation into fairy cakes. Students will bake with differing quantities of sugar, and report on their findings.

MS Teams: Using their school email address and password.


Sparx: Using the 'Log in with Microsoft' button. **Seneca:** Using the 'Log in with Microsoft' button.
