Dear Parents and Carers,

Re: Curriculum Information for Half Term 2 (3rd November to 19th December)

The information in this letter outlines Curriculum, Home Learning, and Extracurricular activities for this term.

Through our curriculum, we provide a wide range of learning experiences both inside and outside of the classroom, aimed at fostering a love of learning and providing opportunities to experience success and fulfilment. Leaders and teachers at HEA and United Learning plan the content, and the sequence of learning, very carefully to aid efficiency and create meaningful connections. We hope that you find the information helpful and a starting point to enable positive discussions at home about subject content and the opportunities that are available within school.

Below is the content that Year 9 students should expect to be taught during half-term 2 of this academic year:

Students will reflect on what would happen to them if they were removed from society's rules and expectations, and how the social, political and historical backdrop impacted Golding's presentation of humanity.	
Maths	Laws of Indices Standard Form Algebra - Expanding and Factorising	
Science	Biological systems; Energetics and rate	
RE	Beliefs about Life and Death	
Geography	Globalisation: how the world has become more interconnected and the consequences of this	
History	The consequences of World War 1 for Russia, Germany and British women.	
MFL	Festivals and traditions: learning about native-speaking countries and festivals, customs and celebrations. Expressing opinions on typical foods and traditions.	
Art	Colour and landscape, the art of David Hockney and perspective drawing	
Computer Science	Programming with sequences of data in Python (second half of the unit)	
Drama	Continuation of the topic 'Hillsborough' - exploring conscience through dramatic techniques	
Food Tech	Exploring Diabetes through an investigation into fairy cakes. Students will bake with differing quantities of sugar, and report on their findings.	
Music	Continuation of Composing for Film Music	
PE	Boys Developing core skills, tactics and leadership through rugby Developing core skills and effective communication through badminton	Girls Developing core skills, tactics and leadership through rugby/football Developing core skills and effective communication through table tennis

Textiles	Recycle and reinvent, making a reversible bucket hat.
Product Design	Tablet Stand: Final manufacture in mild steel.

Sparx: Using the 'Log in with Microsoft' button.

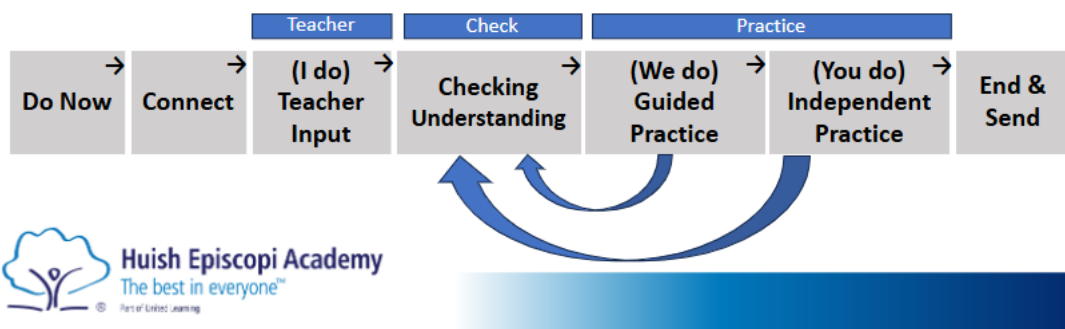
Seneca: Using the 'Log in with Microsoft' button.
